The Rock Hill Body Company is a two-story brick industrial building located on West Main Street in Rock Hill

It was built ca. 1915 as a textile mill (Victoria Yarn Mill #2) and was the home of the Rock Hill Body Company from 1938 to 1986. It is currently being used for storage.

The front façade (facing northeast) has six bays and each side elevation has eleven bays. The large windows are wooden with an arrangement of eight-over-eight lights in a top section, nine-over-nine lights in a middle section, and eight-over-eight lights in the bottom section. A few windows have been altered by being reduced in size or being infilled with brick. On the façade, the lower floor has two windows, a large wooden freight door and a one-story office addition. On the Hardin Street side elevation (northwest), the windows have been covered with plywood and insulation materials. The windows are capped by arched brick openings. Along the sides, there are three brick buttress structures located at the front corner and evenly spaced along the wall. The rear (southwest) has a one-story brick addition with unevenly spaced windows and freight doors.

Alterations to the building include a one-story brick office section on the front. This section, which was added when the Rock Hill Body Company occupied the building in 1938, has a front gable and windows with arched brick above and a three-over-three-over-one arrangement of window panes. The rear of the building has a one-story additional and a tower addition housing a freight elevator. The southeast side also has a one-story extension. The original flat roof has been replaced with a metal roof structure with a gradual slope from a center ridgeline.

The surroundings of the building include a mixture of single-family residential and commercial uses and vacant land. In 2007, an apartment complex is under construction across Hardin Street from the property. The Rock Hill Body Company is located in the Rock Hill Textile Corridor, an area formerly heavily used by the textile industry and now under redevelopment by the City of Rock Hill and private developers.

The Rock Hill Body Company building is an early twentieth century two-story industrial building located within Rock Hill's textile corridor. The Victoria Cotton Mill (originally the Globe Mill) began operation as Rock Hill's third textile mill in 1890. As the business grew, an annex was built about 1915 at this site nearby and was named Victoria Yarn Mill #2. During the Depression operations ceased at Victoria Yarn Mill #2, and the building was purchased in 1936 by J.C. Hardin. Hardin had been an employee of the Rock Hill Buggy Company and withdrew about 1916 when it was converted to the Anderson Motor Car Company to begin his own business repairing buggies and wagons on Black Street in downtown Rock Hill. By the early 1920s, Hardin had begun expanding his operations to include assembly of custom auto and truck bodies. He later added school bus bodies to the line. The Rock Hill Body Company became one of the earliest makers of truck bodies and school bus bodies in South Carolina. As the business grew, its manufacturing operations were moved to the Victoria Yarn Mill #2 in 1938, operated here until 1986. For many years, it was one of the largest producers of truck and school bus bodies in the Southeast. The company pioneered the development of special bodies for soft drink distribution trucks. The building, now used for storage, is owned by the third generation of the Hardin family.

The property is significant for its association with the early development of the textile industry in Rock Hill and also for its association with the important automotive manufacturing business of Rock Hill. Changes to the building after its purchase by the Rock Hill Body Company include a one-story office addition on the facade, an elevator tower on the rear (south), and a metal roof structure. The Rock Hill Body Company building meets the criteria of the property type "Textile Mill Buildings and Related Buildings" of the multiple property submission "Historic Resources of Rock Hill."

Verbal Boundary Description

The boundary of the nominated property is illustrated as a portion of the parcel at the corner of West Main Street and Hardin Street (formerly Lee Street), York County Tax Parcel # 5980901001, with a heavy black line marked "Rock Hill Body Company."

Boundary Justification

The boundary is restricted to the historic building associated with the operation of the Victoria Yarn Mill #2 and the Rock Hill Body Company and its immediate surrounding. It excludes a portion of the front section of the parcel, as well as the rear extension of the parcel along Hardin Street to Finley Road, because these portions contain non-historic buildings.
